

AMENDMENT # 0059Contract # KH225

Effective the latter of December 1, 2020 or the last date of the signatories, this amends the above referenced Contract as follows:

1. The numbers below were last addressed in the following amendments: Numbers 2 – 5 were last addressed in Amendment #0050. Number 6 was last addressed in Amendment #0049.
2. C1-3 is amended to add the following sentence immediately after and separate from C1-3.4.:  
"The trainings can be conducted remotely through virtual forums due to COVID-19 limitations"
3. C1-5 is retitled "**Child Welfare Integration and Support Team (CWIST)**" and "MSP" and "current MSP" are replaced by "CWIST" wherever found.
4. C1-7 is amended to read:

**C1-7            Regionally Necessary Services**

**C1-7.1** The terms of **Section B-3.1** notwithstanding, the Managing Entity may subcontract with Citrus Health Network, Inc. in Broward County for Short-term Residential Treatment (SRT) services to adults.

**C1-7.2** The terms of **Section B-3.2** notwithstanding, the Managing Entity may subcontract for residential mental health treatment services related to the Purchase of Residential Treatment Services (PRTS) for children and youth with an emotional disturbance or a serious emotional disturbance with the following entities located in additional Florida counties:

5. C1-8 is retitled "**Department Priorities**" and amended to read:

The Department has implemented the 4DX operating system designed to formalize the agency's problem-solving methodology and process improvement to achieve critical agency-wide goals. These goals are established by the Secretary or SAMH Program Office. The Substance Abuse and Mental Health goals that involve the Managing Entity will be established at the beginning of each state fiscal year. The Provider shall collaborate with the Regional SAMH Program Office on any data requests needing response or clarification as needed, prior to any scheduled meetings. Timeframes for response will be agreed upon between the Provider and the Department.

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6. The highlighted portion of the table below amends E-3, Table 5. The non-highlighted parts are for illustrative purposes only and are unaffected by this amendment.
